

MSP Combined Foundation and Practitioner Course

Course Code	MSPC5
Overview	The Combined course blends our Foundation course and Practitioner seminar. Each participant is first provided with a solid Foundation in MSP concepts, and is then advanced to a Practitioner understanding of how to apply MSP in realistic programme scenarios and adapt MSP to different programme environments.
Course Objectives	 By the end of the Foundation Course delegates will: Understand MSP's integrated elements and their relationships, building on delegates' own experience and knowledge of large-scale change; Understand the benefits thread through MSP that ensures that the entire programme is predicated and focussed on realisation of benefits; Understand how MSP could be applied in real life situations and undertake practical work in a supportive training environment; Have received careful and detailed preparation for the Foundation Exam.

The MSP Foundation Exam is a 1 hour closed book exam. There are 75 multiple choice questions. The
	candidate must correctly answer 50% or more of the questions to pass the exam. The Practitioner Seminar is a scenario based training course focusing on the application of MSP under
	different programme environments and scenarios. Review and revision sessions of all MSP elements are included throughout the training.
	The MSP Practitioner Exam is a 2½ hour, open manual, scenario based multiple choice exam. The exam consists of 80 questions across 8 syllabus areas presented in the following styles: Classical multiple choice; Yes/No; Multiple response; Matching; Sequencing; Assertion/Reason. The candidate must correctly answer 50% or more of the questions to pass the exam. Candidates for the Practitioner Exam must have passed the Foundation Exam.
	There will be homework each evening. We conduct the exams on behalf of APMG.

Who Should Attend	 Experienced Programme Managers who need to be able to work effectively in an MSP environment; Senior Project Managers wishing to move into programme management; 'Centre of excellence' staff and strategy implementation planners who need a solid understanding of MSP to tailor the method for their organisations; Project and programme support staff wanting to learn how to effectively operate in an MSP environment; Anyone wishing to round out their resume with a formal internationally recognised project management certification.
Prerequisites	Participants must have previously completed the Foundation course. Delegates must have passed the Foundation exam to sit the Practitioner exam.
Course Content	The course is scenario based, and focuses on the application of MSP under different programme environments and scenarios. Review and revision sessions of all MSP elements are included throughout the training. There will be homework each evening. The MSP Practitioner Exam is a 2½ hour, open manual, scenario based multiple choice exam. The exam consists of 80 questions across 8 syllabus areas presented in the following styles: Classical multiple choice; Yes/No; Multiple response; Matching; Sequencing; Assertion/Reason. The candidate must correctly answer 55% or more of the questions to pass the exam. Candidates for the Practitioner Exam must have passed the Foundation Exam. We conduct the exams on behalf of APMG.

MSP Practitioner Reregistration Seminar

Course Code	MSPR2
Overview	In line with international standards on accreditation, the registration of MSP Practitioners and MSP Advanced Practitioners expires after 5 years. Practitioners may reregister from 3 to 5 years after the date they attained their registration. This Seminar provides each participant with an update on changes to MSP since they became registered, then prepares them to sit the Practitioner Reregistration Exam.
Course Objectives	 The Practitioner Reregistration Seminar will: Provide participants with a bridging between the previous and current versions of MSP; Provide careful and detailed preparation for the Practitioner Reregistration Exam or the Advanced Practitioner Reregistration Exam.
Who Should Attend	MSP Practitioners and Advanced Practitioners whose registration is about to expire, and who wish to extend their registration.
Prerequisites	Participants must be Registered MSP Practitioners or Registered MSP Advanced Practitioners.
Content	 The Reregistration Seminar is in two parts: A bridging briefing, during which we provide candidates with an update on recent changes to MSP; Preparation for the relevant Reregistration Exam.
	The MSP Practitioner Reregistration Exam is a 1 ¼ hour, open manual, scenario based multiple choice exam. The candidate must provide responses to 3 questions presented in the following styles: Classical multiple choice; Yes/No; Multiple response; Matching; Sequencing; Assertion/Reason. The maximum score for the exam is 30 marks. The candidate must score 50% or more marks to pass the exam. Candidates for the Practitioner Reregistration Exam must have previously passed the Practitioner Exam. We conduct the exam on behalf of APMG.
	The MSP Advanced Practitioner Reregistration Exam takes the form of a 2000 – 4000 word "dissertation" (suggested target 2500 words) on a specific subject (selected from a range of topics) demonstrating application of MSP. It would ideally be based on a "real life" programme that the candidate has worked within. If this is not possible (if a candidate has not recently worked within a programme or their programme contains classified information), it would be acceptable to base it on the Advanced Practitioner Case Study "MSP Care". There are no time restrictions imposed on this dissertation. The dissertation will be marked out of a possible 75 marks with the candidate needing 38 marks to achieve a pass. Candidates for the Advanced Practitioner Reregistration Exam must have previously passed the Advanced Practitioner Exam.
	Successful candidates will be required to re-register within 3-5 years of the renewed certification.
